All of Us Research Program Overview

General: *All of Us* is working to improve health care through research. Unlike research studies that focus on one disease or group of people, *All of Us* is building a diverse database that can inform thousands of studies on a variety of health conditions. *All of Us* is part of a new era in which researchers, health care providers, technology experts, community partners, and the public work together to develop individualized health care. Several Texas institutions are already participating (list below).

For Researchers: The *All of Us* Research Program is building a dataset to help transform the future of health research by equipping researchers with expansive health data from diverse populations, especially those underrepresented in biomedical research. More than 6,600 health researchers are leveraging this one-of-a-kind dataset to improve understanding of health and disease, identify opportunities to reduce disparities, and enable more precise approaches to care. The *All of Us* Research Program's centralized, secure, cloud-based platform allows researchers across a wide range of settings and institutions and at all stages of their careers (e.g., students, early-stage investigators) to execute rapid, hypothesis-driven research with just a computer and an Internet connection. Refer to the program [FAQ](#) link and two available flyers designed for researchers. Note – Researcher and institution membership is free.

All levels of researchers are invited to participate. This includes researchers in health professions and public health, as well as post-docs, graduate students and undergraduate student researchers.

Registration: There are three steps to register individual researchers (create an online account, attend a mandatory training, and sign a Data User Code of Conduct). But first, the researcher's respective institution must have a Data Use and Registration Agreement (DURA) on file.

Good news: In Texas, all eight public health institutions and half of the public general academic universities have these agreements in place (list below). A webinar on November 8 is offered to promote the All of Us opportunity with Texas researchers and to invite institutions without an active DURA to consider initiating the process.
